



Church Eaton Home School Agreement

Our part - School will:	Your part - you will:
Open to vulnerable children and those of key workers (see the government definition*) from Monday 18 th May	Send your child to school if they are classed as vulnerable or if you require the provision as a Key Worker family - full uniform from Monday please
Open to children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 on Monday 1 st June if the government states that it is safe to do so	Send your child to school in clean uniform every day and talk to them about the new measures outlined in this agreement. Explain how exciting it is to be returning to school but new ways of working and playing are necessary to keep us all safe
Stagger the start and end of the day from 1 st June to reduce you being exposed to large groups	Bring and collect your child at the allotted times and stand at least 2m apart from other parents. Please do not congregate at the entrances for any longer than is necessary or enter the school building (unless you have a pre-arranged appointment, which will be conducted safely)
Ensure that your child is in a group size of no more than 15	Support the new class groupings and talk to your child about the changes in school
Arrange for your child to sit at their own table with their own equipment such as pens, crayons, etc.	Class 4 Provide your child with their own pens, pencils, etc. which will remain in school
Not use carpet areas traditionally used for children to sit together and soft toys that are hard to clean	Talk to your child so that he/she understands the changes in school
Adapt the school day to ensure your child is ready for their next Class in September and provide safe outdoor exercise sessions per day (subject to the weather)	Support our new measures to keep your child safe
Ensure your child remains in their group (maximum 15 children) during break times, which will be in regular 10-15 minute intervals during the day with social distancing applying wherever possible. Staff will supervise this carefully	
Ensure playtimes and lunchtimes are staggered so that children are not on the playground or in the dining room with large groups of other children	
Lay out cutlery for children at lunchtimes rather than children collecting their own from the communal trays	Provide sandwiches if you wish but hot meals will be available
Ensure that hand sanitisers, soap, paper towels and other cleaning products are in plentiful supply at school	Encourage your child to follow good hygiene practices at home and school including washing their hands for at least 20 seconds and avoid touching their faces
Clean the school regularly and thoroughly throughout the day	
For Year 6, provide transitional activities	Support the school and your child as they prepare for the exciting transition to High School
Remind staff of the need to follow strict risk assessments in school including their own health and safety procedures	Appreciate the challenges facing staff
Care for your child and look after them as we always do	Support, as you always do, the school in its endeavours at this difficult time
