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Dear Parents and Carers,

As a part of your child's education at Church Eaton Primary School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives children the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. Please visit the school's website: www.churcheaton.staffs.sch.uk for more detail about our PSHE curriculum.

All PSHE teaching will take place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values. Throughout the year pupils in years 1 -6 will be taught about Relationships, Living in the wider world and Health and wellbeing. As part of our planning for the delivery of this programme, we have ensured that there is consistency with our school's ethos and related policies, such as safeguarding, equalities and bullying.

The programme will be delivered by the classroom teacher. There will be opportunities for the children to work in mixed and single gender groups and exercises will be adapted to take into account different levels of maturity and ability. We encourage pupils to ask questions, seek further information and complete activities at home. We see this work as a partnership between school and home.

Lessons in years four, five and six will include pupils learning about healthy relationships, including friendships; families; growing and changing, including puberty; personal hygiene; changing feelings; becoming more independent; keeping safe; developing self-esteem and confidence. Pupils will also have opportunities to ask questions.
