Class 2 news

Class 2 have continued to work hard throughout this week. We carried on with our *Water, Water Everywhere!* topic whereby we compared the beach now to the beach in the Victorian period to see what has changed. The children discovered that outfits Victorians wore were a lot different to what we wear.

The children also carried on with their music topic, learning all about rhythms and pulses. We watched *Stomp* as a brilliant example of body percussion and what wonderful sounds we can make with our own bodies. The children came up with their own fantastic versions of body percussion using graphic notation. Keep up the reading and practicing your spellings and see you next week!



Class 3 News

Another amazing week of learning. This week we have been learning to recite poems. The children chose from *The Owl and the Pussycat*; *Jabberwocky*; *Green Eggs and Ham* and *The Ning Nang Nong*. The children learnt these poems quickly and effectively in groups giving each other lines to learn. I was particularly impressed with Poppy, Ada and Carys as they chose the hardest and were able to pronounce all the difficult words.

In maths we are continuing to learn about fractions. Last week we added fractions and this



week we are subtracting fractions. Some children are able to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and simplify them, Simply brilliant—I am so proud of them.

During LAC lessons we are continuing to find out all about foods and their origins and in RE we have started learning about Special Foods in different religions.

Class 4 have had another fantastic week of learning! In English, we looked at letter writing, which was linked to our class book, *Malamander*. The children all tried really hard with this and their hard work payed off.
