Open Morning— We are holding our Open Morning in school on Saturday 2nd October. If you know of anyone who is interested in joining our school please let them know.

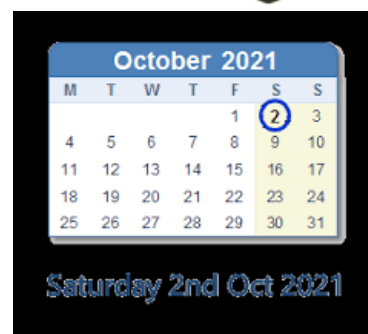
Data Collection Sheets— An important Dojo message was sent this week re data collection. Please return the data collection sheets to school in a secure way as soon as possible and also the IT agreements.
