Mr Shaw has been working with Class 2 this week and he has been very impressed with all of the children. He said that they were polite, kind and perfect role models! I am very proud of all of them!

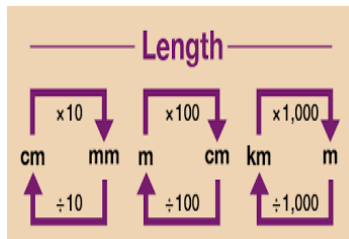
