Class 2 news

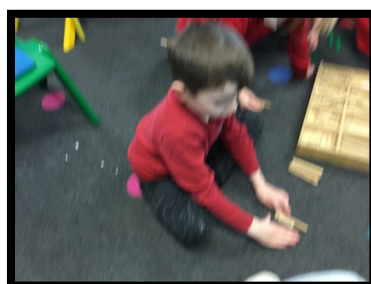
The children have worked so hard this week! They have amazed me with their creative and innovative ideas.

Class 4 News

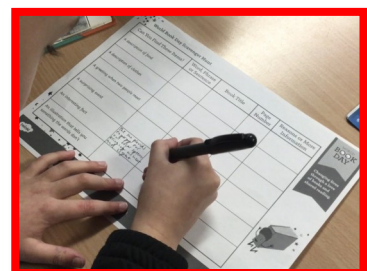
Another wonderful week has been had by all in Class 4.
