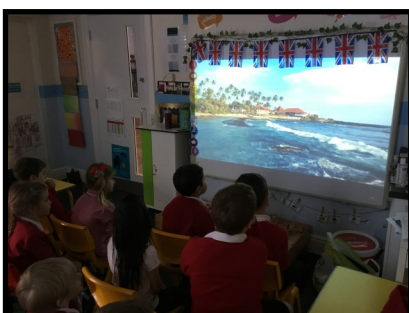
## Class 2 news
