



## Church Eaton Primary School PE and Sports Premium Strategy – Academic Year 2021-2022

The school is expecting a total of £16,600 in this academic year.

£9,683 was received in October 2021. The remaining £6,917 was received in April 2022.

In setting the strategy, the school considered the five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across, as defined by the Department for Education.
